Day 1

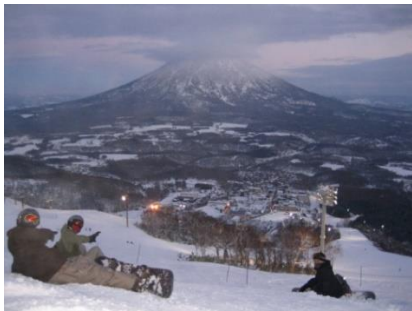
Flight from major Australian city – Tokyo
