Next try out a traditional Bento lunch and go sight-seeing in Asakusa. After checking into the accommodation and freshening up, there is an option to have dinner and drinks at an Izakaya (traditional Japanese style pub)

Day 3



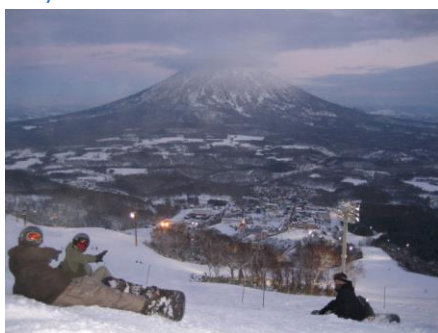
Optional Tour: Check out all the weird, wacky and exquisite costumes at the Harajuku Kimono Furisode. Dine at the famous restaurant in which a Kill Bill scene was filmed at – Gonpachi. Stop over in electronic town Akihabara where you can get your geek on and possibly see how long you last in a maid café before you get uncomfortable. Dinner at a Ninja Restaurant to finish the night.

Day 4



Spend a half day watching the Sumo Tournament and then finish off the night by checking out the sunset and night skyline from one of the tallest towers in Tokyo

Day 5-8



An early check out of the accommodation to arrive at Haneda airport and catch your flight to Hokkaido for a 4 day and 3 night snowboarding session in one of the best Ski resorts in the world – Niseko. This trip includes your return flights from Tokyo to Shin-Chitose airport, bus transfers to your hotel and ski resort, ski passes and snow gear rental.

Day 9



Take a leisurely and fast Shinkansen ride from Tokyo to Osaka. On the way, you will be able to view Mt Fuji while snacking or enjoying a beverage of your choosing. Once in Osaka, Catch the Festival of the Lights and finish of the day with a Fugu dinner (if you dare).

Day 10



Visit Universal Studios Japan. Home to famous rides such as Jaws, Jurassic Park, Back to the Future and even a 3D Spiderman ride. You'll also find one of the only Harry Potter Worlds on Earth here. Great for singles, couples and families.

Day 11



Discover Kyoto and all of its traditional charm and beauty. With historical buildings and gardens, you'll feel like you've gone back in time. If you are looking for something different, you are also able to dress up as a Geisha (for a fee) for the entirety of a day to take your tour. Be warned, you'll be really popular and will feel like a star with tourists and locals alike.

Day 12



After a short Shinkansen ride, you can marvel at a city that has moved on even after the destruction laid after the Second World War. The Japanese also have created a memorial to educate and to allow people to pay their respects for the fallen.



Later, you'll find yourself on Miyajima (an island off the coast of Hiroshima), here you can feed the deer, see the floating shrine and also see one of the most photographed objects in Japan, the 'Gate to Japan'.

Day 13



Make your way back to Tokyo for a lazy day, or if you are really keen, you could visit one of Tokyo's hot springs to soak and enjoy one of the Japanese citizens favourite pastimes.
